Our closing night film is the award-winning Australian documentary *A Fire Inside* presented with the Australian Embassy. A truly moving and cinematic insight into the devastating bushfires that took place in 2019 and 2020.

Michelle's short Ellen Is Leaving (2012) won the Grand Jury Prize for Best Narrative Short Film at SXSW Film Festival and San Francisco Film Festival. Savill's short films have screened at various international festivals including Aspen, Rotterdam, Sydney, Edinburgh, Clermont-Ferrand and Melbourne, where she attended the MIFF Accelerator Programme.

She has also attended the Berlinale Talent Lab and won a script development internship in New York through Script-to-Screen.

When his uncle calls from Australia asking Billy to bring his stash of weed to him on the Gold Coast, Billy sees his ticket out.

Director Vince McMillan is an award winning director. Growing up in Papakura he developed an interest in film from an early age. Equipped with a handycam and a group of friends, what started as a hobby ended up becoming a real passion and career focus. He has shot narrative and commercial projects internationally, shooting and directing in Germany, England, and Australia. Vince aspires to tell New Zealand stories authentically, humourously, all while tugging on your heart strings.



Eighteen year old student Jay has had enough of life. Twenty eight year old world traveller Liz cannot get enough of it. As Jay stands on a cliff contemplating an end to his privileged yet hollow life, Liz lands in Sydney for her latest adventure backpacking the globe. A 'sliding doors' moment brings this unlikely pair together, upon which they form a deep bond – much to the chagrin of Jay's jaded socialite parents. When Liz's laissez-faire lifestyle comes to an abrupt halt due to a mystery illness, Jay becomes entwined in her plight, and all four must confront their world views.


Nadi Sha's directorial debut, *Everything In Between*, premiered in Australia in October 2022, and was praised for its nuanced exploration of teenage existentialism.

In the late summer along the Australian coast, Bosch, a young father goes on the run for drug dealing with his surf gang. In tow is his son, Rockit, who believes he is on a magical holiday.

Inspired by true events, *Bosch & Rockit* is stirring, provocative and peppered with laconic Australian humour, a compelling story capturing the light and shade of life, reflecting our strength and our vulnerability

Fun Fact This film is receiving rave reviews by industry professionals including Matt Damon who was brought to tears when he first watched it, and ended up helping Tyler in post production of the film.

Tyler Atkins is an award winning Australian filmmaker who embraces life with spirit and joy. He loves the beach culture, with an earthy, fit and healthy attitude towards life and living.

Tyler Atkins grew up the hard way. His mother was out of the picture from the time he was four, and with his father also frequently absent, he was largely left to raise himself. His childhood and early teens were defined, he says, by "making mistakes and being left at home and feeling sad and abandoned". Now 36, the former model and clothing designer (and winner of the first season of The Amazing Race Australia) has told a version of his story in his debut feature film, **Bosch & Rockit.**

Eight Pan-Asian female filmmakers craft unique stories set in the same house (kāinga) across several decades, chronicling the diverse and ever-changing experiences of Asians trying to make Aotearoa New Zealand their home. A follow-up to 2017's *Waru* and 2019's *Vai*.

The house at 11 Rua Road bears witness to a visiting Chinese daughter hoping to see her father; a young Japanese mother's loneliness and isolation; a Filipino nurse trying to support both her adopted Aotearoa family and her real one in the Philippines; a young Korean girl's confusion with strangers nosing through her house; an Indian daughter trying to connect with her elderly father through technology, an Iranian wife growing restless with the lack of opportunities as an immigrant; a Tamil Eelam sister looking for old memories and a young Chinese-Kiwi mother's confrontation with her neighbour.





FOR THOM

NZ | 2023 | 16 min | Drama Director: Rafa Yam



Thom is an isolated teenage girl suffering from suicidal thoughts and depression caused by her deteriorating friendship with her best friend Milly. Thom's only support comes in the form of her caring brother Joe. Through Thom's journey of trying to heal her mental state, she comes face to face with what it means to be a friend and how what appears on the surface is hardly ever the full story.

Director **Rafa Yam** is a Filipino filmmaker who moved to New Zealand in 2006. He made his directing debut with his short film *Last Call* which won the U24 Award for Best Film at the 2021 Someday Film Challenge. He was also selected to Script to Screen's Paerangi Project in 2021 for his project *Para Sayo* as well as PASC's Short Cuts Lab for his project *Malayo* in 2023. Still being a young filmmaker, Rafa's stories mostly center around New Zealand based youth issues with a mix of drama and comedy.

UPSODOWN

AU | 2022 | 10 min | Arthouse Director: Nathan Ceddia



Considering the place of mankind on earth, and the role we must play in safeguarding the natural world, Nathan Ceddia directs short film *Upsodown* – a visual commentary on the dialogue between us. Exploring the disconnect between Earth and humanity, Ceddia employs surreal imagery to intensify the gravitas of the present state of us and our environmental crisis. *Upsodown* is a journey of self-awareness and discovery, leading our thoughts back home. Shot on 16mm & 8mm film in Melbourne, Australia.

Nathan Ceddia is an Australian filmmaker. He works in several fields and through various genres. His main focus is creating films that reach beyond the surface of our everyday perceptions. Through the lens of subjective experience, he opens up a unique perspective on pressing matters of our time. Nathan's media practice highlights the individuality and interconnectedness of who we are and how we live.

THE RATBAGGS

Eyebrows raise in the Bagg household when young Sam announces that he would like a Princess Kiana doll for his birthday. Granny Fanny urges father Manfred to set an example of acceptable masculinity. Manfred takes the family on an expedition to the Great Outdoors, but a violent storm strikes.

New Zealander **Patrick Gillies'** short films have been selected for over forty international film festivals, including Montreal, London, Sydney, New Zealand, Clermont-Ferrand (Panorama), and Palm Springs ShortFest. His short, *Huhu Attack!* (2011), features a spectacular musical score performed by the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra. Gillies' second feature film, *The Holy Roller*, opened in New Zealand cinemas in September 2011 and received its New Zealand DVD release in January 2012.

PERIANAYAKI

NZ | 2022 | 11 min | Drama Director: Bala Murali Shingade



A recent Sri Lankan immigrant begins another day at her job stacking shelves at the local supermarket. With her limited grasp of English, she struggles to understand or be understood by colleagues and customers alike.

Since graduating from the University of Auckland in 2018 with an MA in Screen Production, Bala Murali Shingade has been working as a writer, director and actor for screen and theatre. For his MA thesis film, Bala was awarded the Geoff Evans Prize for Screen Excellence and in 2019, he wrote, directed and edited 800 Lunches, a short film commissioned and funded by the Outlook

for Someday. *Perianayaki* is Bala's second short film, funded through Script To Screen and NZFC's competitive Fresh Shorts program. In 2020, Bala was one of six recipients of the Arts Foundation's Springboard award, which recognises emerging artists with outstanding potential.

NAP NAP

NZ | 2023 | 17 min | Drama **Director: Sam Tempelton**



Lying atop an old car, parked in the driveway, a couple muse on love, life, and the learnings we take away from our experiences - except their conversation is unscripted, and the pair on screen are a real couple. With only three takes shot from three angles, Nap Nap draws the viewer into the conversation by placing intimate emphasis on, not just the act of speaking, but the act of listening.

Director Sam Templeton's unique perspective for creating moving images comes from a background in fine arts, as well as his visual and special effects work on feature films in New Zealand.

A self-taught filmmaker, his personal and intimate visual style is represented across his music, fashion and commercial body of work. Upon returning to Aotearoa in 2023 following seven years in Berlin, he is always looking to push creative boundaries while telling compelling, engaging and relatable stories.

BREATHE

NZ | 2021 | 13 min | Drama **Director: Stephan Kang**



A gifted twelve year old, Jaehee uses an unorthodox healing method that propels her into conflict with her overbearing father.

Stephen Kang is a South Korea-born New Zealand filmmaker. His filmography includes Blue, Desert and Breathe. His work is recognised by many film festivals including Cannes Critics' Week, Sundance, New York, Melbourne, Busan, Taipei and Shanghai to name a few. Berlinale Talent Lab alum Stephen is the winner of Grand Prix at 2011 Cannes Critics' Week and a recipient of Asian Producer's Network Award. His latest short film *Breathe* premiered at the 2022 Sundance Film Festival.

Stephen is currently developing a feature film based on the short film Breathe with the support from the New Zealand Film Commission.

NZ | 2023 | 12 min | Documentary **Director: Roberto Nascimento**



A portrait of a family, centred on 95-year old New Zealand actress, Dame Kate Harcourt and her life living with her daughter, acting coach Dame Miranda Harcourt.

Roberto Nascimento was born in Brazil and moved to New Zealand 20 years ago. He worked as an actor and producer in theatre and film - for the past 12 years he focused on being a director and producer of varied content - commercial, documentary and drama.

Roberto has a feature film in development based on his award winning short Boyfriend - as well as working as a producer and director in NZ and Australia. Representation is a big thing, so one of his main passions is bringing authentic LGBTQIA+ stories to life.

MEMORABILIA

NZ | 2022 | 17 min | Drama **Directors: Ceridwen Dovey & Rowena Potts**



In Memorabilia, a daughter mourns the loss of her father, a passionate collector of space memorabilia, as she falls under the sway of the 'flown' space objects in her inheritance.

Voiced by award-winning Australian actor Matilda Ridgway, Memorabilia draws on the Powerhouse Museum's incredible collection of space ephemera to create an evocative hybrid documentary which blends fact and fiction. Combining fascinating archive with dramatic performance, the film interrogates how and why flown space memorabilia comes to be collected and stored for posterity, and why these

objects exert such a strong pull on the human imagination.

Ceridwen Dovey and Rowena Potts are writers, filmmakers, and social and visual anthropologists by training. In 2022, they co-founded the Archival Futures Collective, a creative collaboration dedicated to making experimental non-fiction films about human and more-than-human relationships to nature on and off-Earth, inspired by library and museum archives, research materials, and collections. Memorabilia was created during their tenure as Research Fellows at Australia's Powerhouse Museum.

CUT is a short drama about a young man pulled in different directions by antisemitism, queerness and spirituality.

An award-winning emerging filmmaker with a MA in Directing from NIDA (the National Institute of Dramatic Art in Sydney), Samuel Lucas Allen has been nominated for a Robin Anderson Film Award, Best Director at Sanford International Film Festival, Best Music Video and Best Experimental at the ATOM Awards, Best Director at CinefestOz, and won Best Short Director at the Kansas Arthouse Film Festival.

Based on a true story, *Red*, *White & Brass* follows Maka who brazenly agrees to perform at the 2011 Tonga vs France Rugby World Cup game in exchange for tickets to the match. The only problem is he has no band, no instruments...and no idea.

An underdog story set against one of Aotearoa's proudest moments hosting the 2011 Rugby World Cup. This uplifting, funny and moving film about pride, self belief and the special magic of community, is bound to pull on your heart strings and leave you feeling proud to be a Kiwi (and some of you wanting to be Tongan).

Red, White & Brass is the story of Tongan writer and producer Halaifonua Finau (Nua)'s family, who came up with the elaborate plan of creating a brass band to secure tickets to the coveted Tonga v France game at the Rugby World Cup.

Damon Fepulea'I is an Aotearoa-born director of Samoan and European heritage. He has been committed to Pacific storytelling through his career and is best known for his directing work on the hit New Zealand shows Jono and Ben, Head High and Mean Mums. Prior to carving a strong name in Kiwi comedy, Fepulea'i cut his teeth in documentaries directing the 2003 documentary Dawn Raids as well as A Life In Death, and Life, Death and A Lung Transplant, the latter earning him a nomination for Best Documentary at the Qantas Film and TV Awards. Red, White & Brass is Fepulea'i's feature film debut.

Four divergent Aboriginal artists use their personal stories and historical injustice as a driving force to break through and create internationally recognised urban art.

Dig Deeper is a thought provoking and layerpeeling delve into the fascinating and at times confronting lives of four uniquely different Indigenous Australian artists who share a common thread between their art, their Aboriginality, and their dual heritage.

Director/writer **Mark Street** has worked in the film and TV industry for 25 years as a producer, director, camera operator, editor and sound designer. Most of his work has been at the Australian Broadcasting Corporation on a variety of productions in drama, comedy, and documentary. As a part of the Arts department, he has produced segments for both on-air and online.



DIPPED IN BLACK

Documentary Australia | 2023 | 24 min

Directors: Derik Lynch, Matthew Thorne

An Anangu Yankunytjatjara man escapes the city life to return to country for spiritual healing. Marungka Tjalatjunu (Dipped in Black) follows Yankunytjatjara man Derik Lynch's road trip back to Country for spiritual healing, as memories from his childhood return. A journey from the oppression of white city life in Adelaide, back home to his remote Anangu Community (Aputula) to perform on sacred Inma ground.

Derik Lynch is an initiated Yankunytjatjara man. He is a performer, filmmaker, and artist who grew up between Alice Springs and remote Communities in the Northern Territory and South Australia. He has worked both nationally and internationally in theatre, film and TV.

Matthew Thorne is an SA filmmaker and artist whose work explores the Australian landscape and people through film, photography, and reenactment. In 2022, Matthew received the Adelaide Film Festival & Samstag Gallery of Art Commission.

As the world looked on in horror at Australia's apocalyptic bushfires, the selfless acts of everyday people defined the spirit of a nation, but took an astounding toll.

When a volunteer firefighter drives his car into almost certain death during the worst fires in Australian history, he does it because he "has a job to do". Three months later, the fires are out but his nightmares are just beginning. What's tormenting him, however, isn't the memory of flames.

Turning a sensitive lens on the unprecedented devastation of Australia's 2019/2020 'Black Summer' bushfires, from a country-wide emergency to the astonishing stories of help

that emerged, A Fire Inside presents an inspirational look at the way people respond to crisis and its true cost to the human spirit.

Justin Krook is a Grammy-Nominated documentary filmmaker based in Los Angeles. His debut feature, I'll Sleep When I'm Dead, premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival and was nominated for best music film at the 59th Grammy Awards. In the docu-series world, Krook recently directed an episode of APPLE TV+'s Emmy-Nominated series Home.

Luke Mazzaferro is a Sydney born filmmaker, and a founding partner at Australian production company *Finch*. He has previously worked with director Patrick Hughes on a variety of drama projects including Hughes' feature debut *Red Hill* (Official Selection Berlinale 2010).


